
Chapter House Shows Signs of Aging

One of the privileges of being an alumnae of West Virginia University is to return to our chapter house at 1493 University Avenue—a place that some of you called home and where we all were able to create and share our college and Greek life memories.

Pi Beta Phi's West Virginia Alpha chapter house is a well-loved, historic home, built in 1901. Each of us who have walked her halls will remember how special this house was and continues to be to our chapter. However, as with any structure of this era, it is beginning to reveal its age. We are writing you because of your special connection to West Virginia Alpha and to our chapter house. This is the first time, since 1957 when the addition was added, that we have found it necessary to reach out to alumnae for financial assistance to help repair & sustain our chapter house.

This house would benefit greatly from extra attention that can't be achieved simply through the support which comes through the House Corporation. Despite our reluctance to seek financial assistance from our alumnae, we felt that an issue so central to the lives of past, current, and future Pi Phis might be one that you feel particularly worthy of your support.

What's New at West Virginia Alpha

- Every semester the chapter conducts the Champions Are Readers (CAR) program at Brookhaven Elementary School.
- In Spring 2007 WV Alpha received the Most Improved Sorority award on WVU's Campus
- WV Alpha President, Lara Omph, was awarded the Sign of the Arrow Melissa Scholarship from the Pi Beta Phi Foundation


